

# Website privacy notice

In the spirit of transparency, this privacy notice details how Harbour Energy processes any personal data collected or received when users visit our website <u>www.harbourenergy.com</u>.

### What information do we collect and how is it used?

When someone visits <u>www.harbourenergy.com</u> we collect standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour patterns to find out things such as the number of visitors to various parts of the website.

We collect this information in a way which does not identify individuals and we do not make any attempt to find out the identities of those visiting. We will not associate any data gathered from this site with any personally identifying information from any source. If we do want to collect personally identifiable information through our website, we will highlight this in advance. We will make it clear when we collect personal information and will explain what we intend to do with it.

When you submit your personal details to us via our website 'contact us' function, we will use that information to respond to your message. Your message will be relayed to the relevant department who will respond directly to you. We will never share, trade or sell your information to a third-party for marketing purposes.

#### How do we use cookies?

Cookies are small text files placed on your computer by websites you visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as provide information to the owners of the website. #### Who has access to data?

Any personal information processed via the website, i.e. the website 'contact us' function, will only be shared internally with Harbour Energy staff, if access to that information is necessary for the performance of their roles. ## How do we protect data?

Harbour Energy has implemented a number of operational controls and internal policies to ensure that your data is not lost, accidentally destroyed, misused or disclosed, and is not accessed except by employees in the performance of their duties.

Should any data be transferred outside of the European Economic Area it will be protected by appropriate transfer safeguards, which guarantee an adequate level of data protection wherever your data is physically kept.

### How long do we retain data?
